LARC 1: Desk Research

The desk research focused on identifying and collecting national and European good practices that use cultural activities to promote democracy, volunteering, and active citizenship. The project team analysed initiatives addressing topics such as social inclusion, gender equality, environmental awareness, and community participation through artistic and cultural approaches. The selected good practices were shared through the project's communication channels to inspire citizens and stakeholders, while providing valuable input for the development of the NOTSKIP recommendations and the implementation of the following project activities.

**LARC 2: Street debate**

On 16 January 2026, AJITER organized a Street Debate in Angra do Heroísmo, Portugal, as part of the NOTSKIP project. The activity invited local students to take part in an informal public consultation on the question "How can we live together in peace?". A total of 65 participants engaged in conversations with the project facilitators, sharing personal reflections and practical ideas on how to promote peaceful coexistence in everyday life. More than 30 contributions were collected, highlighting the importance of mutual respect, empathy, active listening, education, solidarity, and openness towards others. The activity strengthened dialogue within the local community, encouraged citizens to reflect on their role in creating an inclusive society, and provided qualitative input for the development of the NOTSKIP recommendations on democratic participation and social cohesion.

LARC 3: Round table

The round table was organized on 27 January 2025 in Angra do Heroísmo, Portugal, bringing together 11 participants, including local stakeholders, local authorities, experts, citizens, and youth representatives. The event focused on strengthening democratic participation and exploring ways to increase citizens' involvement in local and European decision-making processes. Through interactive discussions, participants identified key challenges related to trust in institutions, access to information, digital inclusion, awareness of EU participation tools, and the involvement of less active groups. The discussion highlighted the importance of accessible participation mechanisms, stronger communication between citizens and institutions, the role of local authorities as mediators, and the creation of inclusive spaces for dialogue. The activity contributed to the development of recommendations aimed at promoting active citizenship, transparent participation, and stronger community engagement.

LARC 4: Focus group

The focus group activities were implemented with two different target groups in order to collect perspectives on civic participation, youth engagement, and the role of education in strengthening democratic involvement. There were a total of 18 participants face to face.

FOCUS GROUP: Young people, Youth workers, educators, trainers and teachers

The focus group was organized on 10 May 2026 in Praia da Vitória, Portugal, involving professionals working with young people. The activity explored grassroots initiatives to promote citizens' engagement in shaping the Future of Europe and the role of education in fostering active citizenship. Participants discussed barriers affecting youth participation, such as lack of awareness, limited communication, territorial barriers, and the perception of European processes as distant. The discussion highlighted the importance of experiential civic education, cooperation between schools and local organizations, inclusive participation spaces, and the development of educators' skills in communication, active listening, and participatory methodologies. The results contributed to the development of NOTSKIP recommendations and the promotion of democratic participation.

The focus group also involved young people. The activity explored young people's perceptions of the Future of Europe, civic participation, EU participatory tools, and the barriers limiting youth engagement. Participants discussed key issues affecting their generation, including climate change, education, employment opportunities, and social inclusion. The discussion highlighted the need for more accessible institutional communication, stronger youth involvement in decision-making processes, and more opportunities for participation through workshops, volunteering, youth forums, and digital platforms. The outcomes contributed to the development of NOTSKIP recommendations and the promotion of active citizenship at local and European level.
